

Sat Paul Mittal Inter-University Debate 2024

March 1-2, 2024, at the IAPPD Auditorium, New Delhi

The Indian Association of Parliamentarians on Population and Development, New Delhi (IAPPD), commemorates its Founder Chairman, Mr. Sat Paul Mittal, MP, by organizing the Sat Paul Mittal Inter-University Debate 2024. This event, aimed at strengthening youth skills and capacities, fostering awareness, and generating a better understanding among the youth in the realms of population development and environment, unfolded over March 1-2, 2024.



The Inter-college Debate was conducted across twenty universities

nationwide. Out of these, sixteen universities were qualified to participate in the National Debate, where each institution was represented by a pair of contestants. One member of the team argued 'For' the motion, while the other took the stance 'Against' it. This selection process ensured a diverse and competitive representation, fostering a rich exchange of ideas and perspectives on a national level.

The distinguished occasion was presided over by Prof. P.J. Kurien, Chairman of IAPPD. The Chief Guest, Ms. Andrea Wojnar, Resident Representative UNFPA India and Country Director of Bhutan, graced the event alongside the Special Guest, Prof. Dipendra Nath Das, Rector of Jawaharlal Nehru University.

Mr. Manmohan Sharma, Executive Secretary of IAPPD, extended a warm welcome to the participants, expressing delight in witnessing the enthusiasm of the students. He expressed optimism for a meaningful and impactful debate.

Ms. Andrea Wojnar, in her address, shed light on the UNFPA's initiatives, emphasizing the organization's commitment to ensuring every pregnancy is wanted, every childbirth is safe, and every young person's potential is fulfilled. She also touched upon the significance of Sexual

and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR). She said that since the first country programme began almost 50 years ago in 1974, UNFPA has been working in India to improve reproductive health and rights and to achieve gender equality, including working to eliminate gender-based violence.



Prof. Dipendra Nath Das, while addressing the contestants, emphasized the importance of integrating population education into school and college curricula. Stressing the need for comprehensive awareness, he shared insights into the vital role of population education.

In total, the debate witnessed active participation from 30 students. Following the conclusion of the debate, prizes were conferred upon the victorious teams and individual contestants in a ceremony that highlighted the culmination of the intellectual competition.

In his remarks, Mr. Avinash Rai Khanna emphasized the importance of 'family' and advised participants to prioritize spending time with their families, encouraging them to share at least a daily dinner together. Addressing the challenges associated with aging, he shed light on the rising issues faced by the elderly in the country.

Expressing gratitude to IAPPD for the invitation to the debate, Mr. Naveed Trumboo reflected on the excitement of transitioning from being a contestant in a previous debate to a speaker in the current one. He delved into the transformative power of opportunities and shared insights on how students can derive benefits from them. Providing illustrative examples, he urged students to approach opportunities and challenges with a serious mindset.

In his address, Mr. P.D.T. Achary expressed gratitude to Prof. P.J. Kurien for providing the opportunity to address the debate contestants. He described Shri Sat Paul Mittal as a man of very strong willpower who was passionately involved in activities related to population and development. He delved into the critical issue of malnutrition among pregnant women and children below 5 years in the country, presenting alarming statistics. Notably, he highlighted that almost 45 per cent of children below 5 years are malnourished, leading to stunting. Additionally, he pointed out that a large number of women and adolescent girls are underweight, with a significant portion suffering from anaemia. Stressing the farreaching impact of these nutrition deficiencies on both women and their children, he concluded by emphasizing the urgent need for government intervention to address these pressing problems.
